In light of this. I would like to propose a motion for an upper-spending limit of \$3,200.

Vertigo, according to all receipts available to us, has spent a combined total of between \$17k and \$18k in 2023. This includes: Vol. 1 printing (slightly under \$10.5k), Vol. 2 printing (\$6.2k), Issuu subscription (\$528), and the Website fee (\$30). As far as I can see, we have not been billed for our Google email addresses or Drive account. Other costs under the student publications section of the UTSSA budget that were not a part of the editorial team's requested budget include: our honorariums (approx. \$51k), the research project (approx. \$18k), overheads, and the UTSSA social media position.
