Almost 50% of students at UTS identify as BIPOC and it is essential that their wants, needs, and concerns are heard through the ethnocultural collective.

Why I think am I experienced enough to make a great ethnocultural president:

Is because:

- With my role as ethnocultural convenor last year I helped the past president Suzy with a range of projects such as participating with the multi-cultural women's network, assisted Anti- racism campaign, ethno con and helped with harmony day.
- I help a charity called lighthouse mentoring which provides support and care for culturally diverse kids to pursue higher education.
- Additionally, I was previously a UTSoC education director so I am well-experienced in running a range of events etcetera.

What I would do with the role:

Firstly I would help change and bring recognition to our current equity-related complaints
and grievances system from the center of social justice and inclusion.- As in the status
quo this is pretty much the only way to report racism. Yet this process is tedious and
often ineffective. Additionally, hardly anyone knows about this system and how to use it.
 So for a university that claims to have a zero tolerance for racism, I want to ensure that
we keep this promise and have a system that actually effectively handled these issues of

- racism on our campus and to ensure that students know that this system exists and how to use it when need be.
- this would be done through a range of policies and collaborations to create a proper system for complaints against racism instead of sweeping it under the rug as it is commonly done.
- Secondly, I would also like to bring more awareness to the ethnocultural collective as a
 whole. As currently a lot of students do not know that we exist and can be utilised as a
 collective for things such as activism but also just for having a space to talk about shared
 experiences and to revive support and guidance.
- Lastly, I would like to start a new initiative to have a mentorship program for BIPOC students to connect them to professionals in various fields as a way for the to see what is possible and to help them get the support they need. As I as understand how important having these good role models are.
